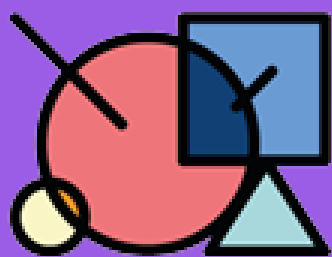

MICRO TASK NUMBER: 3

01 What are the objectives of the task?



The objectives of this task are:

- ✓ To improve the communication skills to create more attractive lessons.
- ✓ To communicate more effectively to benefit from a relaxing teaching-learning atmosphere.

02 What will teachers learn?



This task will give teachers the chance to communicate more effectively by using a puzzle game. Effective communication involves combining creativity with the potential to capture attention. If it becomes a habit, then school teaching-learning will be more effective. It is about visual communication through images and written communication through text, at the end spoken communication takes place to share ideas.

03 Tasks and procedure



The procedure for this micro-task makes it easy to quickly assimilate the necessary steps as follows.

Step 1: To make the blended learning process attractive and successful, a puzzle game will be created and used. The teachers choose 1-2 phrases that are of interest to them and their students. They divide the words in the text as they prefer (it can be 1 word or a group of words) and for each word or group of words chosen, the teachers add a specific image under the text.

Step 2: Together with the students, the teachers randomly distribute the sheets with images and text (if they were printed).

Step 3: The teachers ask the students to work in one group and redo/arrange the puzzle so that the text has the real meaning. At the end, the solution is shown. It is necessary to do this task for at least 2 weeks, 2 times every week.
